




The Foci:

Islam







#### Assessing target problems





### ANIMAL CARE CENTRE AT NEWTOWN, KOLKATA



 WHERE:Spaces designed for both individual learning and group learning, spaces for interaction and retreat for safety.


WHY: To foster individuality within a school environment and form an emotional attachment with its users.

- How does visual connection in between spaces(horizontal/vertical) relate to the social/psychological aspects of curiosity, emotional attachment, privacy and trust among its everyday users?
